# Charles Mosher of Oberlin, congressman for 16 years

Former U.S. Rep. Charles A. Mosher, a moderate Republican who represented the Oberlin area in Congress for 16 years, died yesterday Oberlin's Allen Memorial Hospital, where he had been a patient since Nov. 4 after suffering a heart attack at his home. He was 78.

Mr. Mosher retired from the 13th District seat in Congress in 1977 at the age of 70.

He was editor and publisher of the Oberlin News-Tribune during the 1950s.

He served in the Ohio Senate from 1951 to 1961 before he was elected to Congress. He never lost an election, and served in Congress during a time of pivotal events such as the Bay of Pigs, the assassinations and turmoil of the 1960s. Vietnam and Watergate.

A newspaper editorial written at the time of his retirement called him solid, honest and conscientious.

Mr. Mosher was the first Republican to vote against appropriating funds for the Vietnam War, and was the only Ohio congressman to sign a petition asking the House Ethics Committee to investigate Rep. Wayne L. Hays of Ohio, who later resigned in a sex-payroll scan-

While in Congress Mr. Mosher served as ranking Republican on the House Committee on Science and Technology, and after retirement he became executive director of the committee until 1980. He also served on the House Merchant Marine and Fisheries committee while in Congress.

Mr Mosher was born in Illinois He worked as a reporter on daily newspapers in Aurora, Ill., and Janesville, Wis., before becoming president of Oberlin Printing Co. and editorpublisher of the Oberlin News-Tribune. He quit the post after his election to Congress.

Last year he became the oldest known person at Oberlin College to earn a master's of government degree. Mr. Mosher also received an honorary doctor of laws degree at that time, becoming the only person to receive both

an earned and an honorary degree in the same Oberlin commencement.

His master's thesis was entitled "Reinterpreting the Congress and Its Works," and he once said that he doubted if any year of his life had been happier or more intellectually exciting than the one he spent at Oberlin.

He taught government classes for graduate students from George Washington and American universities in Washington after his retire-

Survivors include his wife Harriet, son Frederick and daughter Jane.

# Joseph H. Crowley, Cleveland's lawman

For four decades, Joseph H. Crowley was the law in Cleveland. He was so much the authority that the position of chief counsel of the city was created for him.

Mr. Crowley, 90, died yesterday at the Hanna House of University Hospitals. He had been hospitalized two weeks.

He worked for a number of mayors during his long tenure, starting with Fred Kohler in 1923, when Mr. Crowley got a job as the humane society lawyer. When he retired in 1963, Ralph Locher was mayor.

Mr. Crowley joined the city law department in 1929 as assistant police prosecutor. He was law director when he was appointed chief counsel in 1941by new mayor Frank Lausche.

Two mayors paid tribute to Mr. Crowley at a 1954 ceremony for him. "He was the man who made me look good," said then U.S. Sen. Thomas A. Burke. Then Mayor Anthony J. Celebrezze (now U.S. court of appeals senior judge) said, "I'll tell you just how good a lawyer this man is. He's so good that he interprets for me the bills I drafted when I was a member of the legislature."

Mr. Crowley authored three volumes of 'Crowley's Municipal Law Procedure and Forms." He also taught at the John Marshall Law School.He received many honors during his lifetime, including being named the Citi zens League outstanding public servant of 1950 and the Cleveland YMCA distinguished public service award in 1958.

He was born on Long Island, N.Y., and gra duated from Western Reserve University in 1916 and received his law degree from Ohio Northern University. He served in the Army in 1918. He was a member of the Knights of

SAN FRANCISCO - Master chef Masataka Kebawashi, 45, was found dead in his bloodspattered apartment, baffling police and stunning colleagues who remembered him as "an artist" of the kitchen. An autopsy failed to determine the cause of death. Colleagues mourned the loss of Kobavashi, who honed his culinary skills in restaurants around the world and whose small French restaurant required reservations weeks in advance. The 14-table restaurant, which Kobayashi called his "jewel box." required reservations 21 days in advance, although insiders recommended making dinner plans two months ahead because no one had ever been known to cancel.

CINCINNATI - Edward G. Harness, 65, a former hoard chairman of Procter & Gamble Co. died at a hospital in Naples. Fla., where he had a vacation home. He kept a home in Indian Hill, a Cincinnati suburb. Harness was on the company's board of directors. A memorial service is scheduled Monday afternoon at Christ Church in downtown Cincinnati. followed by a private funeral. Harness, a native of Marietta. O., joined Procter & Gamble in 1940 and led the company through its greatest period of growth, taking over as chairman in 1972. By 1977, the company had become the world's largest manufacturer of consumer products. Harness worked 44 years for the diversified firm, which now sells food, personal-care and other products internationally.
